The Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs will hold a public hearing to receive public comments on proposed changes to the Technical Standards for Gas Service rule set.

This is a proposal to adopt and amend rules governing technical standards for gas service. These rules apply to gas utility service provided by utilities that are subject to the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission. The rules are intended to promote safe and adequate gas service to the public, to provide standards for uniform and reasonable practices by utilities, and to encourage efficiency and safety. The amendments to the rules reflect the emerging technological advancements in the area of metering, metering equipment inspections, and tests. In addition, the Commission proposes removing references to obsolete equipment from the existing rules. The Commission also proposes to add a rule addressing cybersecurity and uniform reporting practices for the utilities.

Jurisdiction is pursuant to section sections 4 and 6 of 1939 PA 3, MCL 460.4 and 460.6, section 2 of 1969 PA 165, MCL 483.152, section 5 of 1919 PA 419, MCL 460.55, sections 3, 9, and 231 of the executive organization act of 1965, 1965 PA 380, MCL 16.103, 16.109, and 16.331, and section 2(12) of 1909 PA 300, MCL 462.2(12). . Jurisdiction pursuant to MCL 460.10ee(1) and MCL 460.55. These rules will take effect Immediately after filing with the Secretary of State. The rules are published on the Michigan Government web site at <http://www.michigan.gov/moahr> and in the Michigan Register in the 11/1/2019 issue. 

from 2014 to 2017 before he became a manager at the Detroit taproom — the job from which he was fired last year. He says in his lawsuit that Founders tolerated “a racist internal corporate culture” and that office printers were labeled “in a blatantly racist fashion.”

The company’s director of diversity and inclusion, Graci Harkema, has stepped down, saying in her resignation letter that Founders has been more concerned with “winning the lawsuit” than “the loss of customers, loss of reputation, and loss of employees’ wellbeing.”

U.S. intelligence agencies reported Russian, Chinese and Iranian influence operations targeting last year’s midterms, and a senior FBI official recently singled out Beijing as a particular source of concern. Meanwhile, Microsoft recently reported that Iranian hackers had targeted an unidentified presidential campaign along with government officials, journalists and prominent expatriate Iranians.

Any foreign effort to interfere in the 2020 election won’t necessarily mirror Russia’s attack in 2016, when Kremlin-linked military intelligence officers

tion on voting processes. Concerns about foreign influence coincide with stepped-up enforcement of a law requiring the registration with the Justice Department of lobbyists, media organizations and other entities that do the bidding of foreign government.

Special counsel Robert Mueller exposed through his investigation the unregistered, covert Russian campaign to spread disinformation on social media.

The Justice Department is concerned about China undertaking similar activities.

any damage. America’s adversaries might have a stake in the 2020 vote. Trump, for instance, speaks well of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un while deepening tensions with Iran by withdrawing the U.S. from a nuclear deal. He has also engaged China in a trade war.

But some experts are skeptical that those countries will use hacking to try to boost a particular candidate — or to influence the election at all. Much of their hacking has been tied to more narrow national interests.
