3. Purpose for the proposed rules and background:

The proposed rules will provide a regulatory structure that would allow the sanctioning of kickboxing and Muay Thai events in Michigan. They will improve the reliability and competency of event officials and improve the safety and the integrity of "unarmed combat" events in Michigan.

4. Summary of proposed rules:

The proposed rules provide a regulatory structure that would allow the sanctioning of kickboxing and muay that events in Michigan. The rules will improve the reliability of event officials and prevent the appearance of impropriety. The rules will also set a minimum purse requirement for professional unarmed combat sports. Other changes include more flexibility in obtaining a professional contestants license, adding an atomweight class for mixed martial arts, and making the mixed martial arts rules more consistent with the Association of Boxing Commissions and Combative Sports uniform rules.
