The Department of Health and Human Services will hold a public hearing to receive public comments on proposed changes to the Michigan Physician Orders for Scope of Treatment rule set.

Michigan Physician's Orders for Scope of Treatment (MI POST) is an optional, 1 page, 2-sided medical order documenting a person's wish regarding his or her care in a health crisis. MI POST is a part of the advance care planning process that include choices about Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), critical care, and other wanted care. It is intended to guide care only if the person cannot tell others what to do at that time. The purpose of these rules is to comply with the statutory mandate of MCL 333.5676(1)(c) in creating this form and instructions on how to complete the form, reauthorize, and/ or revoke the form.

The proposed rules will take effect immediately after filing with the Secretary of State.
